### **Group Letter**



Water. After a dry winter and spring, the hose pipe bans started from mid-July, when I penned this piece. Three heat waves so far and virtually no rain. The harvests are stunted and the Earth is cracking open. I hope the Hambleden Brook does not dry up again as it has in many previous years. I think it is still fed by the 2014 winter (certainly not by the last one!).

And so, we are reminded again what a basic necessity water is for our very survival. In the heat, it is water that can cool us the quickest (I envy all those with swimming pools). Dehydration can cause more health problems in the summer than the cold does in our increasingly mild winters. I wish all those travelling abroad in August for the traditional school holidays will have the weather they hoped for, which is probably dry and sunny. May they have unrestricted access to the sea/pools; and may they be conservative with their use of water: drier countries have it worse than us.

For those staying in England for August, you will want it to continue warm and sunny for your staycation. Gardeners and farmers are praying for rain. Having said that, I note the forecast for St Swithin's day, 15th July, is rain. If 40 days of rain do then indeed follow, those farmers and gardeners should be relieved.

On hotter days, our grandson's favourite activity is putting his hands under the kitchen tap, delighting in the sensation of tepid water trickling through his fingers. There is an absolute magic about water, as well as it being life-sustaining.

So, if it rains this August, give thanks to God. If it remains sunny and warm, give thanks to God. And in all this, as we drink and enjoy our water, remember what Jesus said to the woman at the well: "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."





## Wild with Water - Wild Church by the river, Sunday 13th July

It was such a pleasure to be part of this wonderful and engaging service this afternoon. Being given the opportunity to worship outside, celebrating God surrounded by his creation, sparks a unique peacefulness that is so often absent from our daily routine. In particular on the riverside, it was a brilliant setting for passive outreach, with those visiting the river separately from the service choosing to join in too, including some canoeists who moored up to participate. For my mum, it was her first Wild Church service, and she said it was lovely to be part of a different type of worship in such a beautiful setting.

The setting of the trees, river and ducks brings home the importance of considering the world God has provided for us in all we do, and the humns were perfectly chosen to cement this while also being great to sing (Guide Me O Thou Great Redeemer is one of my favourites). But making water purifiers from simple materials also brought home the stark differences between our community and others elsewhere who are not so fortunate. It was a fantastic activity in which the children were able to actively participate and clearly saw the results of their efforts. My kids loved making them! And it provided an opportunity to demonstrate to them, and a reminder for all of us, how difficult it is for so many who do not have ready access to clean water.

I really would encourage you all, whatever age, to join us for the next Wild Church service in September - celebrating God outdoors certainly helps me find an island of peace among hectic

family life, and this unique and special form of worship makes me feel closer to Him than ever.

### Theo's Epic Ringing World National Youth Contest Adventure

On Saturday 5th July, I joined the Bucks and Berks Young Ringers (that's B&BYR if you're cool like us) for a ringing-tastic day out at the Ringing World National Youth Contest in Birmingham. We had a full team of eight ringers – just enough to ring the whole set.

We set off from Marlow way too early, but that

was instantly forgiven when the party bus kicked into gear. There was a disco, and – most importantly – chocolate waffles.

First Stop: St Peter's, Harborne. This was a lovely ring of 8 – but the tenor bell had attitude. It just wouldn't stand properly! I liked

their pinboard – it had sticker charts to track your progress, which is a great idea. Also, ringing bell 4 meant standing in a little nook, which made you feel like a secret agent ringer.

Next Up: Bellstravaganza at St Martin's. This tower is BONKERS. It has sixteen bells – the only one like it in the UK! Ringing there is like being in a heavy metal concert. There are so many bells, the sound crashes in like a giant guitar strum. I rang the 8. Or maybe the 9? Hard to say when there are ropes everywhere. Our team leader was impressed – ringing on 16 bells is no joke, and this was a first for most of us!

Before our next tower, we had a go on two minirings - tiny bells you can ring anywhere. They're



fiddly: you have to twist your hands in a weird spaghetti pose, but I figured it out and managed 120 changes of Bob Doubles. The person running the ring said it was the nicest sounding ringing all day.

Game Time at St Barnabas. Now it was time for the real deal: the competition tower. Things got spicy. My tail end flew out during the practice, and in the real test, it came untucked halfway through. So I rang with a floppy rope slapping me in the face the whole time. Did I give up? NO. I powered through like a true tower wizard. Bonus drama: the 3 and 4 ringers had to stand way too close together, the 4 bell was shouting louder than the rest, and the 7-rope looked like it had blood on it. Mental metal. Afterwards, we strutted out of the church like champions.


