



We were lucky to have a few local farmers present who gave us their thoughts on what to be grateful for and what is a concern for them. Gideon Lacey talked about the beauty of the landscape around Lacey's Farm, and the sound of



the cows and birds early in the morning. His concern was around the bureaucracy which can seem to be inefficient. Bella talked about the appreciation of seeing the cows, sheep and crops being produced by her farm and then successfully going to market. Peter Langford from Northend mentioned the wonder of seeing his cattle growing on his smallholding and how grateful he is to be living where he is in the Chilterns. Maddie McTeague from Mill End Farm then gave us an appropriate Bible reading on farming.







The Wild Church choir took us through 'God, whose farm is all creation' and 'We plough the fields and scatter' and the congregation sang along in fine voice. There were many families present and with an assortment of glass jars, tea light candles, glue and dried leaves, decorated lights were made to place around the tractors and ploughs as traditional 'plough lights'. It all looked really amazing.



A Naturalist's Reminiscences No. 12

On my first day as Riots Officer in Nicosia I soon learnt why the British Army was in Cyprus. I was sitting parked in my Land Rover with my sergeant and driver waiting to see whether that morning it would be the Greeks on one side of Ledra Street attacking the Turks on the other side of the street or the Turks attacking the Greeks. It was neither.

When a Greek Cypriot schoolgirl aged about 16 walked down our street towards our parked Land Rover, we were not focused on what was about to happen. As she passed our Land Rover, she threw a grenade under where I was sitting. I knew we had only a few seconds to escape the blast so I shouted "Run". I don't think any of us ever ran so fast and we caught up the schoolgirl and arrested her. It was only at that moment we realised that the grenade had not exploded. We walked back gingerly to the Land Rover in case the grenade had a delayed action mechanism.

WILDLIFE AND HAMBLEDEN

Actually, there was no such grenade at that time or probably ever was, such was our ignorance!

When we reached it. there was the grenade lying there. Thev had never told her to take out the pin! She explained to us that a member of EOKA (Archbishop Makarios' armed wing) had threatened to harm her family if she did not throw the grenade under a British military vehicle. We felt very sorry for her and when we took her to the Central Police Station. I was able to persuade the station officer that she was the innocent party and she was released.

All these years later I still have an occasional nightmare about that grenade.

The Rev Andy Storch explained the meaning of the Christingle orange, with its sweets, candles and red ribbon.


