We will leave with very fond memories of the warm welcome and support that we have received across the Valley; and we are sorry not to have been able to be with you for a number of recent celebrations and commemorations

However, throughout this time, a few familiar friends have been taking services and pastoral offices: my sincere thanks especially to Carol, Mieke and Peter; and to Penny and others for holding things together.

The important thing now is for us all to look ahead.

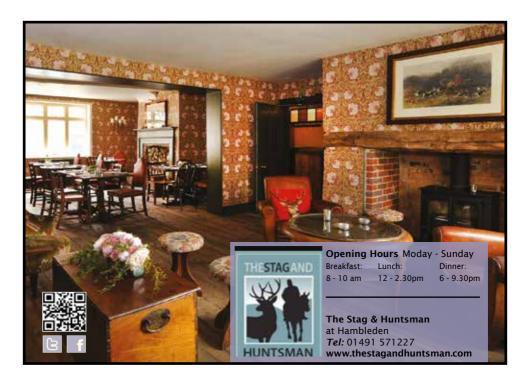
With honest reflection and patient faith, the Valley churches will find the love, the joy and the peace that God intends.

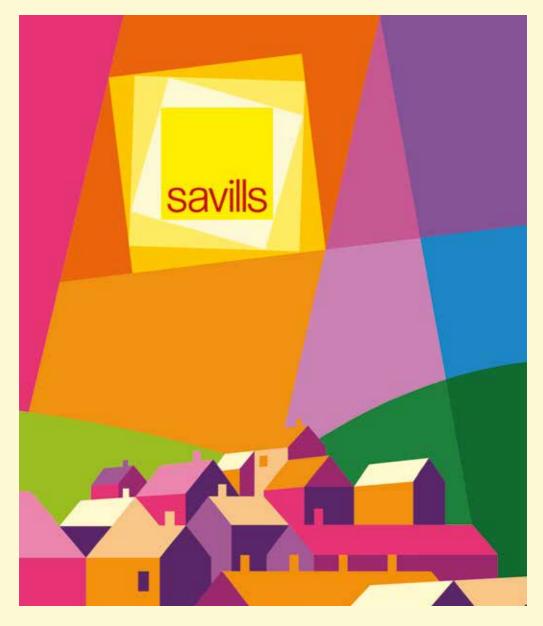

Fingest Past

Fingest Farmers in the 1800s (1) – William Nash, born in 1823, was farming in Fingest from the middle of the 1800s into the beginning of the 20th Century. His farm of 280 acres, situated in Chequers Lane, Fingest, was known at this time as Fingest Farm. In the late 1890s to early 1900s it became known as Fingest Manor Farm. H. Cripps Q.C. and his son had purchased Parmoor in 1873 and began buying land and properties in Fingest and Skirmett to form part of the Parmoor Estate. In 1894 they established a farm of 63 acres together with a new farmhouse in Fingest next to Ivy Cottage and the Chequers Inn. The new farm

TURVILLE

The History of Cliveden Conservation and its link to Turville Village.

Cliveden Conservation was founded in 1982 by former Turville village resident Trevor Proudfoot who sadly died in September 2019. The workshop was first set up to conserve the National Trust's growing statuary collections across the country, with Trevor as Advisor to the Trust for Stone and Plaster Conservation – a position he held until his death. In 1990 the company moved away from the sole employ of the National Trust,

and has since offered an impressive range of remedial and preventative conservation services to commercial and private clients as well as

larger heritage organisations.

Agoliath in the conservation world Trevor involved with important conservation projects on an international scale including Aphrodisias one of oldest and most sacred

sites in Turkey. Closer to home he led many prestigious projects working with the National Trust, Historic England, Historic Royal Palaces and Oxford University to survey and conserve external and internal architectural features, historic objects, monuments and statuary.

In addition to repairs to St Mary's Church in Turville and other local buildings, Cliveden Conservation recently completed works to clean and repair a highly decorative altarpiece of gilded marble, designed by the novelist and poet Thomas Hardy at All Saints, Windsor. The discovery, cleaning and restoration of the Thomas Hardy Altarpiece has transformed the whole building: it is once again a focal feature of this beautiful church.

St Mary's Church in the village of Datchet was another special project. As well as restoring the external stonework of the spire, Cliveden
