GROUP NOTES AND NEWS

Changes to Marriage Registration

You might have noticed on the news recently the changes being made to marriage registration procedures in England. These are the first major changes since the 1800's – so exciting news indeed! There has been great delight over the inclusion of the mother's details now to match the fathers. The bride and groom can also list up to four parents each to include step-parents. Both of these additions reflect the changing nature of society and family make-up. At the end of the wedding ceremony, couples sign a document which is then sent to the Registry Office who will produce the marriage certificate and keep a digital record of the marriage.

For the churches this means less administration as we no longer write up the registers or issue marriage certificates. The original registers will be sent back to the Registry Offices but duplicate registers are kept in the churches. It has been fascinating to have look through the Fawley Register of Marriages. The first marriage recorded was on October 18th 1837 of John Hughes and Sarah Church. John was a labourer and Sarah a servant. The most recent wedding was in July 2019 between James Burke and Lucy Veys. James is a solicitor and Lucy a doctor. How things have changed! We look forward to welcoming the 22 couples who will be married in the Hambleden Valley this year.

Once again, thank you so much for your generosity.



number of horses I am told is on a 'need to know basis'. Belle is at Bath Uni, about to start her last year after a year in industry and Tash is in lower sixth at school. Belle is often to be found working at the Stag and Huntsman in Hambleden.

I am Chair of Fawley Parish Meeting and have served the Fawley Community for over seven years. I was a part of the Fawley Fibre Broadband project that has brought gigabit fibre broadband to all the residents and premises in Fawley village. I want to help our rural 'not-spots' get gigabit capable fibre broadband and I am helping several villages to set up Gigabit Community Schemes.

I have set up and 'admin' a village WhatsApp security group linking several villages, which reports and warns of nefarious activity in the neighbourhoods.

I am also a campaigner for road safety and slowing traffic in our rural villages where we have many walkers, cyclists, horse-riders and vehicles sharing the narrow roads, many of which have derestricted speed limits. Potholes and fly tipping are two areas where I have been pushing to see improvements locally and will continue to do so in the Chiltern Villages.

As chair of the Parish Meeting I am also involved in trying to save our village pub, The Walnut Tree, from being turned into a residential development by the wealthy owner who also owns the Hurley House Hotel. Having bought the pub in 2011 he promised the village that he would build a new one, part financed by enabling work in the form of some cottages. Planning permission was obtained with the support of the entire village in 2017. Sadly, he now refuses to build the pub and we suspect he aims to get his investment stake back by building a residential development.

On 6th May I was elected one of the three Councillors for the Chiltern Villages Ward on the new unitary Buckinghamshire Council.

WILDLIFE

In praise of.. Red Mason bees (Osmia bicornis)

Oh, the joy to watch several fluffy, fresh faced, little Red Mason solitary bees hatching out of cocoons in front of my eyes this week: for once I wasn't in Waitrose, walking the dog or washing my hair. Last year, albeit with only seven cocoons, I missed each one. This vear with sixtu-five, my chances were always higher. The males are thought to be the first to chew an exit from their dark maroon cocoons. It is all about pheromones and on sunny days. those males are frantically flying into and around my release box wishing the ladies they can smell inside would get a move on. After mating the males die and the females look for holes in masonry hence the name, cardboard tubes or naturally available hollow stems in dead plants, to use as a nest site.

My understanding of the process is this. First, the female plugs the far end of her nest with mud to prevent ill-intentioned intruders reaching her precious eggs and provisions via the back door. Starting at that end she makes a cell in which she lays a female egg next to a pile of pollen and nectar and this is repeated for two further female eggs. She completes the row with cells containing male eggs also provided with sustenance but smaller rations... and the females are bigger! Finally, she seals up the entrance with mud to keep parasitic wasps or flies out and shimmies off to repeat the process elsewhere. Her eggs hatch into grubs, eat their picnic, pupate into bees but spend the rest of the year in the nest. The following Spring, the males, believed to be nearest the entrance, hatch first, followed by females and the life cycle starts again. Scientific research suggests that **solitary** bees are 30%-100% more effective pollinators than honey bees. I find it fascinating but agonising to watch the lengthy ovipositor of the parasitic ichneumon wasp disappear into a tube of bee cells to lav its own egg while the female bee is out: I am afraid the urge to whoosh it away gets the better of me sometimes.

For anyone considering buying a nesting box for these incredible solitary bees, the best ones are those with either drilled holes or bamboo tubes which are approximately six inches in length.

Hambleden WI - May 2021

Seventeen members joined our third Zoom General Meeting on May 13th for a presentation by Simon Williams, whom we first met in person in January 2020 for his talk about magic and illusion. On this occasion, Simon took us back in time to the events surrounding 'The Great Train Robbery'. He engaged us with his fascinating, colourful and detailed insight into the planning and sequence of activities, which took place before and after the robbery and the personalities involved. He introduced us to each of the 'gang' members, highlighting key facts about them, including their lives following prison. So many interesting anecdotes: the stolen money worth £42million at today's value, 8 bags being left behind and 128 stolen, all stuffed with £5. £1 and 10/- notes: only 1/6th of the money was ever recovered and worst of all it wasn't insured: whilst at their hideaway the robbers played Monopoly using the stolen money; they each gave a £5 note (taken from the haul) to Ronnie Biggs, the day of the robbery being his birthday. At the time of the robbery one of the robbers, Roy James, was a promising racing driver as well as being a silversmith; some years later, following his term in jail, he made the Formula One Race Promoters' Trophy for Bernie Ecclestone, which to this day is still presented annually. Simon concluded with the interesting observation that, despite being 50 years on, the brains behind the robbery, 'Mr Big', has never been identified. There have been a number of theories but nothing ever proved.

Future WI events and activities include the next walk on Tuesday 25th May at 10.30am, meeting at the Flower Pot, Aston, RG9 3DG. The next General Meeting will be on Thursday 10th June at 7.30pm. Once again, although hopefully for the last time, we will meet via Zoom when John Pearson will talk about 'Blessed are the Cheesemakers, Cheeses & Cheese-tasting'. John has spent his working life in the Food Industry primarily selecting cheese products for Marks & Spencer and since retiring has consulted for a number of suppliers and retailers.

The week started with a bang – quite literally – with a visit from the Royal Institute of Science with their 'Energy Live!' show. The children were treated to a range of fiery and explosive demonstrations of what energy is and how it affects our lives in an exciting journey through the stores of energy that surround us, from elastic to gravitational, kinetic to chemical. Demonstrations included Ethanol Rockets, Pie Dishes on a Butane Bowl, a Balloon Popping Race, Steam Exploding Paint Tin, Butane Bubbles, an Electromagnet Tug of War and more! Our children left knowing their elastic from their gravitational and feeling fired up about









energy, with a newly-enthused approach to Science to start them off in their exciting week.

Throughout the week, the children continued to explore and experiment with a wide range of environmental topics, engaging in activities which included exploring pollution, flooding and climate change, growing plants, cooking on a solar oven, exploring renewable energy, making a bee bath, investigating materials, building a bug hotel, creating a wild area and hatching caterpillars into beautiful butterflies. The Year 5 children planted fruit trees in the newly created wild flower meadow and the school were very grateful to Funmi Boyle for all his help and advice with the planting.
