In this world after the pandemic, where we have been kept apart and isolated, we now need to come together in new creative ways, as opposed to just slipping back into the past and hoping somehow someone else will make it all as it was.

Fare well and may you all know the grace of God, the love of Jesus, and be touched by the flame and spirit of Pentecost.

Community Spirit



I'm sure there are many different ways to describe "Community Spirit" and everyone of them is correct to that individual.

The Wikipedia definition is "Community spirit finds expression in individual or group activities in which members of a community choose to engage for the benefit of that community. These activities may be locally organised, or informal and spontaneous".

My own definition of Community Spirit was pleasantly re-awakened recently. For the past 15 years I have organised the Chiltern Vintage Tractor Charity Run. In the early years the main driver was to raise funds for our local Thames Valley Air Ambulance. So many people in the area also believed that this was a very good cause. They supported the event at all different levels from marshalling and catering through to driving a tractor. The donations were so gratefully received and each year to our collective amazement we kept beating the record of monies raised from the previous year. As the years progressed, I realised that the momentum of the event was picking up. So much so that people taking part were looking forward to the following year's event almost before completing the current year.

Then came 2020. Community Spirit took on a whole new meaning. Protecting the vulnerable, the NHS and each other.

As we moved into 2021 there were a lot of people asking about the run and whether it would go ahead. We closely tracked Government guidelines to what was possible and Sunday 4th July 2021 was approved by the insurers. The theme Independence Day was thus formed and the 2021 Vintage Tractor Run started to take shape. There was tremendous support from all areas. Particularly the local farm and land owners whose grounds we were planning the route over. The Thames Valley Air Ambulance themselves were providing volunteers to supplement the brilliant core team made up from the Meakes, Newcombe and Rogers families, that is so pivotal to the success of the event. Prizes for the raffle were being handcrafted or gifted along with homemade cakes and other delights. Over 60 vintage tractor drivers and their families signed up immediately.



An important part of the start of the event over the years has been the unique blessing provided by the Vicar and choir of the Hambleden Valley Churches. This year was no different. The Reverend Sue Morton and her amazing team gave a

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lovely blessing to all those attending. It was gratefully received and after the hymn (We Plough the Fields and Scatter) and, dare I say, humorous blessing, we all left the field with spirits high for a fabulous day ahead.

The volunteer marshals were sublime in their handling of the serious part of road safety, the volunteer catering team kept the participants stomachs fed from morning bacon rolls, to a Lacey's BBQ lunch, through to the end of day tea and cakes. Everybody just loved the whole ambiance of the day and was glad to be doing something "normal". Donations taken on the day were strong and are still coming in.

Hambleden Valley Garden Club

It was with great anticipation that the garden club was able to go on our first garden visit for almost two years. This first visit was to the nursery of Green and Gorgeous near Wallingford which is a cutting flower nursery originated and managed by Rachel Siegfried and her partner Ashley.

Green and Gorgeous is a farm of just over two acres of flower fields, orchards, and herb and vegetable beds near Wallingford. Rachel's idea for Green and Gorgeous began 10 years ago whilst working in

an 18th century walled garden in the Cotswolds. She became aware that the natural beauty and scent that surrounded her was missing from the commercially grown, cut flowers. Rachel decided to bring the beauty of an English garden to the world of cut flowers.

Our tour was led by Ashley who gave us an amusing and informative insight into how they manage the flowers and cater for the needs of their clients. To see fields of flowers en masse is not only a wonderful sight but also the sweet smells waft around every corner.

The bulk of their work is designing and supplying arrangements and bouquets for weddings but they also include courses on photography, growing your own cut flowers and floristry. They have a "pick your own" each Saturday and sell flowers from the farm gate.

To follow on from this visit we have arranged an interim garden visit in July to Jonathan Hogarth's garden to view his hosta collection, which he exhibits at National shows. We had our very first Zoom lecture with Jonathan back in those long dark days of winter! We have also planned a visit to the gardens in Turn End, near Haddenham, in September and then we hope we can resume live Garden Club meetings in October. We already have a full programme booked.

In praise of... crimson shoes amongst the grasses

My parents died one after the other in the mid-nineties and the ghastliness of it all completely altered my perception to life and the world around me. I was enchanted by wild flora and fauna anyway but suddenly I could see beauty not just in patches of delicate silvery lichen adorning branches lit by shafts of sunlight or gilded by winter frosts but in almost every blade of grass or a dandelion, especially one tenaciously growing on a wet, grey pavement. I began to appreciate the sheer beauty of nature everywhere. The closer I peered, the more I learnt and realised how entwined humans are with wildlife. The Natural World depends on us to protect it for we need it to care for us; the benefits are definitely in our favour. Noticing nature is an act of mindfulness in itself, bringing another dimension to a walk and with the help of the 'Picture This' app (there are other apps available) very quickly snowballs into a respectable bank of knowledge. The beauty of nature still intoxicates me daily and I am more excited these days by yellow rattle finally growing in my little meadow than Mulberry handbags.

One of my favourite wild flowers is grass vetchling (*Lachyrus nissolia*). A small, single magenta flower is attached to a stem so slender it disappears in the surrounding grasses; the plant is only noticeable when in flower. Also known as grass pea or crimson shoe, this stunning bright pink jewel of a bloom is about the size of my little finger nail, screams "look at ME" and appears to hover unattached above the wafts of tall grass stalks. I am lucky to have a decent patch established here albeit dangerously close to where cars turn. I will collect a few ripe seed pods this year and attempt a satellite site somewhere safer. They are annuals, grow up to 80cms high and the seed pods are narrow and 2-3cms long. Little gems such as grass vetchling are all around; peer a little closer and I promise some of your discoveries will light up even a dull day in a matter of seconds.

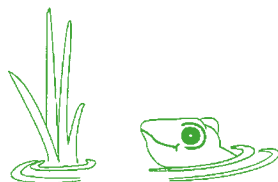
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Sue Hunt Memorial Service

FRIETH

Ackhampstead

A short extract from a history compiled in 1969 by Dr. G. H. Wyatt a former resident of Moor Common

In a quiet overgrown grove of trees to the south east of Moor Farm, Lane End, lies the site of the remains of the chapel of Ackhamstead. Until about 150 years ago the area known as Ackhampstead had a population which required its own Chapel. Late into the 19th century this area was

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known as Lewknor-up-hill being part of the Lewknor hundred and the Chapel was the responsibility of the Vicar of Lewknor.

Ackhampstead is not mentioned in the doomsday book (1086) but is mentioned in an account of the Abbey of Abingdon, which states that in 1052 it was granted to the Abbey by King Edward and Queen Eadgitha "from sorrow at the under nourishment of the younger monks". The earliest reference to the Chapel seems to be that of 1242 in the deed of endowment of Lewknor vicarage by the Bishop of Lincoln, stating that the Vicar or his Curate are required to celebrate in Ackhamstead Chapel every Sunday and on the feast of the Apostles.

During the last years of the Chapel's active life, the last entry in the Baptism register was in 1849, the Vicar of Lewknor came to an agreement with the

Rector of Hambleden who undertook to provide a Curate, the Rev. Menzies, to provide services at Ackhampstead. He described the population around the Chapel as being almost heathen, many of the people being unbaptised. In 1847 it was resolved to remove the Chapel to Cadmore End. During the necessary court hearing it was stated that the 'parishioners of Ackhampstead would not suffer unduly because a new Chapel at Frieth would be convenient and was shortly to be consecrated.' There is no doubt that some of the material from the demolished Chapel was used at Cadmore End and it is possible that the single bell was also transferred. The Chapel was consecrated in 1851 and was dedicated to St. Mary le Moor to preserve the link with the old Moor Chapel.
