# **Group Letter - May 2022**



### Dear Friends,



# **Footprints Service**



On the 20th March attended the Footprints Service St Maru the at Virgin Church in Hambleden. This was started by the Rev Sue Morton 8 years ago. The service is for anyone who has lost a child during

pregnancy or at any stage of life.

It is named after the famous poet Mary Stevenson about a dream in which the person was walking along a sandy beach with the Lord and there were 2 sets of footprints in the sand: but sometimes there was only one set of footprints and the Lord explained "that was when I carried you". The service has a great team and there is music, hymns, candles to light and a paper footprint on which to write your child's name and take to the altar. To share memories and to help each other is so special.

Our daughter Zoe died when she was 13 in 1985. One of the team knew her and said how she remembered her hair. Zoe had long dark wavy hair. It was so good to hear that and afterwards we told her brother and sister.

During the service we were told a story of a grieving mother who broke a precious bowl, but did not throw the shattered pieces away. She kept them and, following the Japanese Kintsugi tradition, she began to repair the bowl, mending the cracks in the bowl and highlighting them with gold leaf paint. Every crack, every chip is beautifully emphasised in gold - not hidden or masked, but made to stand out. The repaired bowl was not the same as it was before, but still beautiful. The process of repairing the bowl began a process in the mother, on her own journey. She realised that both the bowl and the journey required time and patience.

At the end of the service, we were invited to take away some small pieces of pottery to keep as a symbol of hope. After the service there were refreshments and a chance to talk to others. At the back of the church there was a plate, for anyone to donate to Child Bereavement UK

and Compassionate Friends, who were a great support to us

Thanks to all who helped to make the service so special and thanks to Sue Morton for starting Footprints.

# A call for help with our magazine postal service!

Each month 33 copies of our magazine are posted to subscribers who are dotted around the country. Most, if not all, will have lived among us in the past and value keeping in touch and hearing of news from the "Valley" villages. We seek a volunteer to give a little time each month to the posting of the latest edition. The related cost of stamps and envelopes is met by the Group and can be claimed from the Group treasurer. After printing by Higgs in Henley all our magazines are delivered to Christine Wells who then telephones our distributors to announce their arrival. The magazines can then be collected from Christine and the distribution begins.

At the start of each year, you are asked to attach a note to each magazine that is being posted out indicating the required payment for that year and giving your address in case the recipient wishes to pay by cheque. The amount is a total of the magazine subscription (currently £16 per annum) plus the stationery and postage. At the moment the total figure is £27 per annum. A list of these subscribers and their addresses will be provided. Ideally, we hope that subscribers will pay their subscription by bank transfer directly into the Group bank account. However, there will be some who still prefer to send you a cheque and these are then passed on to the treasurer. Where a subscriber does pay directly into the Group bank account the treasurer will

let you know of this.

The contact with our villages is much appreciated by our wider readership and we hope that enabling this service to continue will appeal to you our reader or perhaps to someone you know who can offer a few hours each month.

# **Churchyard Reminders**

As we come into spring and summer, our churchyards (we have 7 in the Hambleden Valley) receive more visitors who come to pay their respect to those whom we love but see no longer. This is a beautiful thing to do. In the wake of Covid, we are also finding that we are interring more ashes of people who died, often without funerals or had very limited numbers of people in attendance. Our churchyards are beautifully maintained and we take pride in the care that goes into making sure that they are peaceful. In order to maintain such standards, I am taking the opportunity to remind people of a few of the Churchyard Regulations set by the Diocese of Oxford which apply to us:

- -Individual gardens (including the planting of shrubs) are not permitted. This includes any planters or tubs, candle holders, statues, knick knacks, decorations
- -A small number of bulbs may be planted
- -We aim to be plastic free so please do not leave plastic flowers or wreaths at any time of the year (the exception is artificial poppies to commemorate those who have died in the service of their country)
- -Cut flowers and silk flowers (not in plastic wrapping) may be left but removed when they have decayed or become faded
- -3 toys or similar objects may be left at the place of burial for period of up to 12 months from the date of burial and then removed

We do try to keep our churchyards looking the best that we can. In order to do this, I can remove objects & flowers which are not permitted or past their sell by date. This is not to be uncaring or unkind but to maintain a sense of reverence and peace for all visitors. Please do contact me if you have any questions:

### In praise of ponds large and very small



The importance of a garden pond cannot be over exaggerated. It is without a doubt the most effective resource to increase the value of your garden to all wildlife. Even the smallest offerings will have a huge impact. BBC Springwatch ran a campaign in 2017 encouraging people to bury a washing up bucket away from trees, with large stones or an exit plank on one side to help creatures who may fall in, an aquatic plant or two on the other and filled with water: safe in the knowledge of making a real difference to any passing newts, frogs, dragonflies, birds, mice, hedgehogs and insects - you get the idea. A pond for wildlife is ideally one without a pump which inevitably sucks up tadpoles and one without fish because they eat frog and newt tadpoles; toad tadpoles are apparently poisonous to fish. If you have visiting ducks, fish may eventually follow because mallards fly in with fish eggs on their feet: inexplicably I have a small shoal of indistinguishable river fish of varying sizes which I can only assume have arrived this way. I have three watery havens. One I inherited. A second. I excavated muself through flint and chalk with a pickaxe when I was younger and stronger. The third, well, of course I have a sunken black washing up bucket, in unity with the hundreds of people with smaller gardens than I across the UK who did exactly the same. The bucket is a rewarding and educational project to install with young children and they can help keep it filled: visiting robins and thrushes particularly love it. This year I was delighted to have a single clump

of frogspawn for the first time ever in pond number two alongside the trails of toad spawn. I hope the goldfish won't eat the former and I wonder how they tell the difference? Swallows love garden ponds and my anticipation has reached fever pitch that a pair of these beautiful birds may return to breed here following an unexplained absence of three years after a continuous run for decades. I envy any of you, enjoying swallows flitting at speed across your ponds, drinking, bathing or simply catching a snack. I miss this spectacle and if none appear over my horizon, any invitations to watch yours will be readily accepted!

# Celebrating 65 years as Organist!



May 1957. a young girl of arrived Hambleden for an interview with the then Rector, Wilfred Watts. She convinced him that what Hambleden wanted เมลร Christine Wells and, with some trepidation, the two

agreed that she would commence her duties as Hambleden's organist. Christine, our Director of Music, has been the organist at St. Mary the Virgin Church, Hambleden for 65 years. There is no other person who has contributed so much to so many for so long in the cultural life of our community. Her efforts touch three generations already – she has played the organ for weddings of grandchildren, for whose grandparents' weddings she also played the organ – and it is difficult to imagine life in our community without her. Or lives would be substantially impoverished without her talents, hard work and reliability.

Christine is unmarried, and music is her life. She is superbly well qualified. She has a Bachelor of Music degree from Durham University; is a fellow of the Royal College of Organists; a Licentiate of

the Royal Academy of Music; and an Associate of the Royal College of Music. She has played many organs and her cello all over the country and could probably have had a brilliant career in the wider music world, but she has chosen to devote her life to music in the Hambleden Valley. In doing so she has made an enormous contribution to the musical life of the community.

In Hambleden, Christine has played the organ at almost all the church services for 65 years, including innumerable weddings and funerals. She has trained the choir over all those years with practices taking place often in her house and also in the church. In 1984 the Church of England requested a group of six parishes, including Hambleden, to work together with only one or two priests. Since then, Christine has taken on the training of another Valley choir, in Frieth. She also plays the organ at Frieth and in many group services at the other four churches in the Valley.

In addition, Christine has initiated and puts on a series of five or six professional concerts each year in Hambleden Church. She has organized and built up an increasing group of "friends", whose generosity allows Christine to attract some of the finest musical talent to Hambleden, thereby enriching the musical life of the community. These concerts have been taking place for more than 30 years. If the concerts make a loss, Christine dips into her own pocket, if they make a profit, she makes a donation to the Parochial Church Council.

More recently, Christine has started a series of Tea Concerts which take place on three or four Sundays a year. These concerts are free to those visiting, who can drop in and out as they wish, picking up a cup of tea and a cake in the porch. For these concerts Christine persuades friends and colleagues to give their services for free, and often she is part of the team performing.

At Christmas, in addition to the Nine Lessons and Carols and all the Christmas church services, Christine takes the choir around the villages, to houses and other establishments to sing carols. In this way she has raised more than £25,000 over the years, mainly for her favourite charity, Sightsavers.

Her choirs have visited cathedrals and other churches to take the services when the incumbent

choir is having a week's break, often on Low Sunday. This is an excellent opportunity for the choir to gain wider experience. From time to time, Christine will take on a major work which is beyond the scope of the Valley choirs. In these instances, such as Handel's Messiah, Verdi's Requiem or Vivaldi's Gloria, she will put together an orchestra and bring in high quality professional soloists and reinforcements from other local choirs of repute.

But Christine's work in the community is much wider than this. She has taught cello and organ all her life, sometimes privately and in the past at Wucombe High School for Girls. She is always very happy when she hears that one of her former pupils has won a place at the Academy or at the College or has obtained some kind of distinction in music. She is called upon by the community for all sorts of events. It is often said "When you need something done quickly or well, ask a busy person". This is true of Christine. Standards are always kept high. Christine expects everyone to give of their best for the best music. One of our past priests, rather disparagingly, suggested that Christine had cathedral pretensions. Hooray for that, say I! Her contribution has been recognized nationally by Christine receiving the British Empire Medal for her services to music and the community.

Christine has always said that music was her life. Happily, she is not thinking about retirement. With the limited resources of a rural community to draw from, she and we can be truly proud of her achievements, and I cannot think of anyone who has made a bigger contribution over their lifetime to the cultural life in our community.
