



#### Bats in the Belfry

In a recent edition of the Henley Standard there was an article on a Bats in Churches Survey. I wondered whether any of our readers might be interested in taking part in it? Contact details are available below. Apparently, no skills are necessary and training will be provided.

I don't wish to be involved myself this time because a decade ago St Mary's Church, Fawley, needed a roof replacement. Before this could be accomplished the diocese required a bat survey. Guess who was required to commission it? Research came up with two brothers who were the leading bat experts in this country and they agreed to do the survey

on a summer night for a suitable fee. I warned everybody in the village including the local gamekeepers of the date and that if they saw lights in the church during the early hours it would be the brothers at work. I did not think it was worth informing the local police because they had never been seen in Fawley for years in daylight let alone at night.

The brothers duly arrived. They obviously relished the task and their fee for undertaking the survey. After briefing them I returned home. About 2am the next morning I received a telephone call from them saying that they had been arrested by the police and so would I come immediately to the church to explain to the police what they were doing. It took me the best part of an hour before the police would release them!

Don't get me wrong. Any volunteers would be supported by the partnership between the Bat Conservation Trust, the Church of England, Natural England, the Churches Conservation Trust and Historic England. I cannot see the local PC Plod arguing with that lot but think of the possible rewards - Beatification, Ennoblement, and, none the less deserving, a plaque in the church porch.

#### **Quiz for Ukraine**

To all those who attended and/or contributed to the Quiz for Ukraine held on June 10th - we raised a wonderful £1,291 on the night which means that, with Gift Aid, we were able to contribute a stunning £1,614.75 to the Ukraine Disasters Emergency Appeal Committee.

At Ukraine's borders with Poland, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Moldova, people are arriving with only what they can carry. £30 provides essential hygiene supplies for three people for one month, £50 provides blankets for four families and £100 provides emergency food for two families for one month, so you

With the help of Reverend Sue Morton, we have recently trialled a new wellbeing initiative, known as Space Makers, which



#### Wynyard Wallace 1936 - 2022



Wynyard was born in Simla (now Shimla), northern India. It was a popular hill station, once the summer capital of British India where most of the government and many military personnel and families would go in the summer months to escape the

relentless heat of Delhi and the plains. The town is built on a ridge surrounded and overlooking wooded hills of pine and oak and with views of the snow-capped Himalayas. His father was serving in the Indian army.

In 1945, with the war in Europe over and travelling made easier, Wynyard's mother returned to England bringing Wynyard and his younger sister, Primrose. His father followed later after Independence. Wynyard was sent as a boarder to a prep school near Brighton. Not long after returning to England his father became ill with cancer and he died when Wynyard was 12. After leaving prep school Wynyard went on to Wellington College where he completed his schooling. He then joined the BUFFS Regiment to undertake his

national service which was spent in Germany.

On returning to England, he settled in London where he shared a flat with four other bachelors, all who remained close lifelong friends. He worked for a large paper company and in fact he spent the rest of his working life in the paper trade, eventually acquiring his own agency and representing a Swedish company.

In 1963 he married Belinda Milne. They continued to live in London where they had two children. Roland and Anna. They then moved to Kent where a third child, Duncan, was born. Wynyard continued to work in London commuting from his home in Kent. He often described this as being one of the happiest times of his life. He was young and energetic, happily married with three delightful children, a lovely old house and garden, lots of friends and a job which he enjoyed. This idull came to an end when the office moved to Windsor and it became too difficult to commute there daily from Kent. So. in 1977 the family moved to Frieth and Little Parmoor. The children went to local schools and Wunvard soon became involved in the church and local community. He and Belinda began taking in guests for bed and breakfast. In 1985 they separated and later divorced. He and the children continued to live at Little Parmoor. In 1988 he and I were married. Wynyard worked from home but also travelled around the country visiting customers, with occasional trips to Sweden. We built up the bed and breakfast into a successful business.

In November 2002 Wynyard fell down the stairs and broke his neck. He never fully recovered and it affected his mobility. He later developed a neurological condition which affected his mobility even further. In 2005 we downsized to Little Frieth to a house which was more suitable for his needs. Over the years Wynyard's condition deteriorated and for the last five years of his life he was completely unable to walk or stand unaided and we became dependent on carers coming twice daily to help me get him up and back to bed with the aid of wonderful equipment loaned by the Council. He was so brave and uncomplaining when life was so difficult and

restricting and he always retained his sense of humour. At home he enjoyed listening to music, watching television and looking out over his garden, with views across the valley and red kites swooping and swirling in the sky and, of course, visits from his family and friends.

Wunvard was involved in many different things in the church and the community over the years. He started and organized the Lent Lunches around the parishes, which have continued in Hambleden and Frieth, raising funds for Christian Aid. He took a major role in the annual Easter Bonnet parade and is remembered for walking around the village square with a megaphone and a placard marshalling the participants and wearing a ridiculous Easter bonnet himself. For a short time until his health prevented it, he was the standard bearer for the British Legion. He was a member of the PCC for many years. But most of all, he felt really privileged to be a Churchwarden of Hambleden and Frieth. a post which he shared with Jill Wennberg and held for 15 years. This involved him in a considerable amount of time and work. especially during interregnums of which there were several during his tenure. He later became Chairman of the Group Executive.



Wynyard's deep Christian faith was central to his life and gave it purpose and meaning. He wasn't afraid of death and believed without a shadow of doubt that there is life after death. This has been a great


