Dear Friends,

As I have been preparing for Holy Week and Easter Sunday this year, I have been getting a bit excited about the singing of one of my

favourite hymns. Okay - maybe a bit lame - but you can only really sing it on one day a year! This hymn was originally written in the 14th century as a Bohemian Latin hymn and has been subsequently translated into what we know today as 'Jesus Christ is Risen Today'. Charles Wesley, the great founder of the Methodist Church, wrote it for Easter Sunday in 1739 for the very first service at The Foundery Meeting House in Moorfields. London.

This hymn captures, in a few short verses (it was much longer), the joyous Easter message of Jesus' rising and triumph over death to save and redeem us. Despite the suffering and terror of the cross, Jesus endured for God's great love for us all. Love comes at a high price. We are reminded of this on Good Friday when we contemplate

the cross, as we languish through Easter Saturday and finally celebrate love's win on Sunday. All 6 churches (provided St John's Frieth is operational again!) will have services on Easter Sunday. Please join us!





'Hidden Hands: Women and work in the Chilterns' exhibition & events at Wycombe Museum



Historically, women's paid work has often been belittled and forgotten. This exhibition hunts down the hidden women's work in Chilterns villages that formed a crucial part of the local economy during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries.

Discover how the luxury goods made by these highly skilled workers contrast with the harsh reality of working long and poorly paid hours from their homes.

Hear stories of straw plaiting in Buckland; caning and rushing chair seats in West Wycombe; lace making in Great Hampden; and braiding and beading in Holmer Green. Come to learn more about the crafts, women's lives and their impact on the Chilterns.

The six-month long exhibition opened at Wycombe Museum on 7th March, and has been curated by the Woodlanders' Lives and Landscapes project team in partnership with Wycombe Museum and Buckinghamshire New University, and forms the museum's Summer Exhibition. A series of events including Discover and Make sessions, a family day, lacemaking workshop, Bodgers Pub Tour and a 'memory day' will take place alongside the exhibition.



In praise of restoring the Hamble Brook, our chalk stream

A chalk stream should be a flowing course of pure, clear, sometimes but not always constant water from underground aquifers and springs meandering across flinty gravel beds supporting native aquatic plants, fish, insects, birds such as kingfishers and mammals for

example otters. The Hamble Brook has been assessed by chalk stream experts as being of poor ecological status due to a scarcity of the aforementioned but the exciting news is changes are underway to reverse its fortunes. I attended the public meeting in Hambleden village hall on March 7th where plans were unveiled to restore three reaches of the brook totalling a kilometre to improve its natural function to better support all sorts of wildlife, us included. Chalk streams occur where chalk lies on the bedrock and globally, 85% are in southern England. The Hamble has been recorded as being a winterbourne brook since the 1930s which means it is expected dry up for parts of the year. However, abstraction or perhaps more accurately over-abstraction is a cause for concern and research is ongoing to establish if there is a connection between our ever-increasing need for water in our homes combined with reduced annual rainfall and consecutive dry years for the brook. During the Hamble's expected dry periods when the ground water isn't high enough, the stream bed provides a habitat for rare species that are adapted to living in temporary water environments, many of which require the drying phase to complete their life cycle. Over the years the Hamble has been modified, straightened, restricted and even widened in places. Trees creating an overhead canopy have been lost and not replaced and if there is no shade anywhere during hot periods the water temperature rises, oxygen is lost and living organisms die. It is an ambitious undertaking by The Chiltern Chalk Streams Project and it is only possible because of the support of the landowners of the first three reaches proposed for restoration this year. The silt will be removed to uncover the gravel, widened sections will be narrowed, semi-circular shores will be built along the stream bed on alternate sides to make the water course sinuous again and improve flow. Finally, a diverse and ecologically valuable riparian habitat will be developed on the banks to stabilise them and keep out the silt but in very high groundwater situations, allow excessive water to flood

creating small but valuable marshy habitats. All three reaches were surveyed last summer and many of us have signed up for some instruction on correctly recording our finds this year after the restoration is complete. Pond dipping in the name of citizen science in a gently babbling brook with a picnic lunch on standby – what a delightful prospect.

Fawley Green's New Hedge





Last month Sarah Ronan described the hedge at Colstrope, this is another.

Fawley Green has a beautiful newly laid hedge in the Southern England style, crafted by Clive Leek and his team, from an old hedge which had been neglected for many decades. Clive has laid many hedges in Fawley and the surrounding area, including my own about 20 years ago.

This is a countryside skill practised for centuries with many regional varieties in style and technique. The stems of a line of shrubs or small trees are partially cut through and bent near ground level, to encourage new growth from the base. It is then capped by weaving long hazel sticks between stakes driven into the ground at intervals along the

NB Dogs will be allowed but kept strictly on a lead and not in the marguee.







John Piper lived at Fawley Bottom, down the road from my family in Fawley village. He moved to an abandoned old house in 1934 He was pretty ascetic and not too fussed about comfort. Later, my grandmother called on the Pipers, John

and Myfanwy (who wrote librettos for Britten's operas). She thought them "bohemian'".

They appeared to be unwed (Piper's first wife had run off with another artist). They had no phone, no running water, no electricity. Transport was a pony and trap. A pig wandered about.

My grandmother never quite understood

people who didn't shoot or hunt or play cricket. "What do they do?" she would ask.

Years later, when we had moved to Turville Heath, John and Myfanwy came to dinner. In a car. They bickered, but they always did. John had given us some of his sketches but along one wall in the living room was a huge painting by Piper of Rome, which my father acquired in 1960.

"I lugged the thing up from the cellar when I heard you were coming," I jested to Piper when he arrived. I thought it was mildly amusing. No one else did.

At dinner, he spoke of his stained-glass windows in churches around the valley and of his work with John Betjeman on the Shell Guides to the counties, books he illustrated with his pen, brush and photographs (he was a skilled snapper).

He said: "The guides were meant for the new breed of motorist — a plus-foured weekender, Betje called them. We were



obsessive church crawlers so we were right for the job, I suppose." They both loved unfashionable architecture. And ruins. Sadly, Hitler gave them a surfeit of ruins.

As a (Home Front) war artist, Piper painted these derelict shells. And after the war he laboured to preserve the neglected parish church

Piper called himself "a painter who is also a churchman and a lover of churches". The church was the "greatest patron in history". He didn't think atheists should adorn churches. I worked with him on the V&A's Change and Decay exhibition in 1977, which tried to halt the destruction of rural churches. Piper was a High Anglican by instinct.

Most people know Piper from his Baptistry Window in Coventry Cathedral (with the craftsman Patrick Reyntiens), a return to abstraction.

But his unique art can be enjoyed in the Chilterns nearer his home. It was Chartres Cathedral that sparked his passion for the spiritual drama of stained glass: the "thrilling shock of light coming through a maze of richly coloured glass, in general darkness". He was 10.

He loved early art, its primary colour contrasts ("like Picasso"). "The medieval glass-painter could do no wrong." I asked Piper whether he would lead a group of friends on a local cultural tour. He said he would but, sadly, dementia intervened. He died in 1992.

In the early 1930s some residents of Fingest felt that there was a need for a community hall to be built to serve the villages of Fingest, Skirmett and Turville. A site for the hall was found in Fingest and in late 1931 Lord Parmoor gave a twenty-one-year lease on the piece of land for a hall to be built. Despite some local opposition and Hambleden Council's refusal to grant permission on the grounds of town planning. An application was made to the Ministry of Health and in October 1932 permission was granted.

The hall was a wood framed building resting on brick piers with an external cladding of wavy elm boarding and cedar shingles on the roof. Inside the walls were lined with asbestos sheeting. A foyer with a cloakroom on each side led into a 20×30 feet hall with a committee room and a kitchen at one end. There was a small movable platform

acting as stage with tubular curtain supports. Heating was provided by a solid fuel boiler in the main hall. The hall opened for business in early 1933.

In 1960, we moved back to South Bucks. Dad bought a shop in Lane End, not 200 yards from Harry's birthplace. We started visiting Medmenham again. By then the ferry and the old sheds were gone.

That things put into the 'Swilly Hole' near Frieth would eventually emerge at Medmenham. Of Mr Bendir's advice to avoid the bookmaker 'who always wins'. Of 'punting' on the river, Cycling. Swimming a mile a day. He taught me to swim there too. He never lost his taste for fried eels, either, and often fished for them down near the ferry.

For me Harry has remained in my mind's eye, a constant presence.

These days I seem to go to more funerals than

christenings or weddings. And often I hear Scott Hollands words quoted "why should I be out of mind because I am out of sight".

It is there in my mind's eye, the 'Old Chap', as mum called him, has remained the passing years. Recently, more so. It is there I find him, and

there you have him, the last Ferryman. Born into a world unchanged for centuries, the year he died, all had changed.

What would Harry say, could he see us now, with our cars, planes, computers and our smartphones? Perhaps what he used to say to me when I came back from school and told him of my day. "You're a clever old stick," he would say, "but you can't lay eggs!". I still can't!

Sharing these memories with you is both a pleasure and a privilege. Particularly because your group of parishes includes not only Medmenham, but also Hambleden and Frieth.

To Hambleden came great, great, great grandfather William from the Sonning/Goring area in the 1790s. There he, and successive generations of the family lived and worked over the next two centuries "in all the changing scenes of life" as the old hymn puts it. And in Frieth, of course, my wife's family, the Simmons, also lived and worked.

Thank you for putting up with my ramblings.


