Group Letter



There is a good bit of neighbourly gap-bridging going on in the Hambleden Valley at the moment. One of the most moving and heartfelt emails to arrive in my

inbox recently was a message from the Community Matters Foodbank in Lane End (see p7). The Foodbank had been set up to bridge the gap for those who simply did not have the wherewithal to put food on the table for their families, perhaps being between jobs or due to illhealth. And we have the opportunity to be gap-bridgers ourselves by continuing to support our Foodbanks, especially at our Harvest Services as we give thanks to God for his provision for us and for others.

Henri Nouwen, the Dutch priest, wrote: To become neighbours is to bridge the gap between people. As long as there is distance between us and we cannot look in each other's eyes, all sorts of false ideas and images arise... We forget that they are our brothers and sisters...Only when we

have the courage to cross the street and look in one another's eyes can we see there that we are children of the same God and members of the same human family.

And there are other gap-bridgers crossing the Deanery and beyond who are being good neighbours to us in the Hambleden Valley by supporting us in services across all our churches over three months of vacancy. We have a wonderful variety of ministers, from supportive curates to Bishop Alan, who are taking Group and regular Sunday services or Wednesday Zooms. Join us at the Group Service at Frieth on 1st October, 10am, to meet The Revd Liam Cartwright from Cowley Parish and the Anglican Asian Living Church; Liam was Director of Music at All Saints, High Wycombe, prior to his ordination.

These ministers are bridging a gap for us and blessing us so that we can continue with our pattern of worship – please do come along and to support, encourage and pray for those who are bridging our gaps. May we bless them and welcome them warmly.







Community Matters

Barbara Ewing from Community Matters in Lane End has sent a heartfelt letter of thanks for our support for the Foodbank. As we approach Harvest time in our churches, let us continue to support our Foodbanks. A list of muchneeded items is below, thank you so much, Revd Sue Morton.

To Everyone in the Hambleden Valley Churches

It has been some time now since Community Matters has last sent you a huge and deeply felt thank you for all your support to us over the past year. In all honesty, without your help, we could not possibly have offered the work and care we give for the struggling families of Lane End who are trying to cope with the ups and downs of life, especially in the current climate of our cost-of-living crisis. We would like to share some of the work and projects we have needed to do over the past 12 months.

Without any exaggeration the 2022/23 winter months have been the hardest we have encountered in the past several years. Even taking into account the government subsidies for gas and electricity prices, we saw many families who could turn on heat for only a short time every day, families sitting in the dark without electricity, families having to choose between heating food or their homes, families having to top up their pre-paid metres every couple of days. Community Matters had to dig deeply into our bank account to help their utility payment problems, (even buying logs for a household that had no gas supply.)

On a more personal basis, here are some of the situations we saw before us this past year in the 25 families who have been referred to us by various professional organizations:

The need for food and household cleaning items never stops and we continue to have our foodbank every two weeks where each family comes in separately at an allotted time of half an hour to choose food and then to sit in a warm corner of Holy Trinity Church and talk to us about their lives and problems and countless worries, which are many. Quite often families also contact us even between foodbank weeks and we never turn away from their needs, always inviting them to come to the church for "topping up" from our food storage cabinets thereby helping them with their food bills. At Christmas, each family is given a generous ASDA gift voucher.

We bought a new tyre for a family car and also children's duvet covers and other bedding for a family who had just paid an electricity bill and had absolutely no money left for these items which were very much needed. We purchased a washing machine to replace an old broken one for another family

Three of our families had serious medical problems necessitating appointments in various London and Oxford Hospitals. Community Matters offered transport costs by paying for train tickets, and petrol and parking fees. In some cases we also actually drove families to medical appointments ourselves.

School uniforms are often needed and although most families can buy these uniforms second hand at their schools, we help with additional purchase of shoes, PE kits, school

bags, polo shirts, etc.

In conclusion, Community Matters again wishes to thank everyone who has contributed to us with food donations, gifts of cash and with prayers. Without any hesitation we want to say how very much your generosity has gone to making a bit of heaven come to earth for our families and helping Community Matters attempt to paper over some of the niggling problems in their lives. They used to tell us they lived from paycheque to paycheque but it is guite common now to hear them say they live from day to day. We have many thank you cards and personal stories from people we help through Community Matters on the wall at Holy Trinity Church which you are most welcome to look at. Thank you again.

In praise of the ivy bee (Colletes hederae)

Penny McLeish contacted me in early



September to suggest I should take a look at something unusual she had noticed in the churchvard at Medmenham: namely hundreds of bees at ground level behind railings in the grass to the right of the entrance to the church. What I found was a well-established colony of ivu bees at the precise moment females were emerging from underground nests and were being pounced upon by numerous males in a frenzied attempt to mate. The result is described as a mating ball (See photo). Ivy bees are widespread in Europe but the first British sightings were recorded in Dorset in 2001 and they are gradually spreading. An ivy bee is a mining bee, similar in size to a honey bee, has an orangey brown hairy thorax, black and yellow stripes on its abdomen and is approximately 1-1.3cm long. Given I saw

around a thousand bees that morning, this will sound contradictory but it is a species of 'solitary' bee that happens to like nesting in aggregations. By this I mean there is no single gueen just hundreds of females creating nesting chambers in the same place preferring fairly dry soil in south facing locations. As their name suggests, they time their mass hatching to when ivy is in flower and are our only autumnal solitary bee. The males appear first from the underground burrows followed a week or so later by the females. They mate and the females set to work on the next generation either refilling existing burrows or making new ones. This whole process takes around six weeks and then they vanish for another year. Please hold off cutting back any ivy until winter and particularly if you live near Medmenham church. Flowering ivy everywhere is currently humming with activity, the abundant pollen and nectar produced by its tinu flowers is a superb source of food for all autumn flying pollinators. These beautiful and gentle ivy bees are without stingers and are not aggressive; it was an extraordinary and mesmerising sight. I had not seen even a single ivy bee before, let alone the very rare spectacle of a synchronised emergence, so thank you Penny.

Memorial to Major George Howson






