#### **Group Letter**



We stand on the threshold of a new year, on the first step of 2025. Some of us may be ready to go leaping and bounding into 2025 rather like Kiva the Hungarian Visla puppy who will have joined us for Christmas Day, full of enthusiasm and excitement at new things! Others of us may feel more reluctant, finding it hard to leave 2024 behind, perhaps grieving the loss of someone or something special and longing to hold on to that precious time a little longer.

Surprisingly, it is here that a sixteenth century Spanish nobleman – who suffered a nasty injury in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521 – can be helpful. 

#### **Advent Countdown to Christmas**

It's easy to forget what Advent means and what it symbolises. The word comes from the Latin meaning 'to come' or 'to arrive'. In effect it's the Church's Countdown to Christmas. To little children – of which I was once one - Advent has a more material connotation: eagerly awaited calendars with a chocolate hidden behind each of the 24 days leading up to Christmas Eve and the arrival of Santa Claus. To the Church, Advent is the supremely important period that heralds the coming of Jesus Christ and the preparation for his birth on Christmas Day.

All these thoughts swam round my head many years ago when I visited the Church of Nativity in Bethlehem when I was reporting the Israeli Palestinian conflict.

The reputed actual spot where Mary is believed to have given birth to Jesus lies in a cold, small cavern deep beneath the Church, accessed, I recall, by a winding stone staircase. The cavern is claimed to have been the stable where the baby Jesus was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger. The journalist in me inevitably questioned the historical accuracy of the site – the destination of millions of pilgrims from all over the world - but it provided a timely reminder of what Christmas is all about. The birth of Jesus.

I was reminded of this on Sunday 1st December when the ancient bells of our Parish Church, St Mary the Virgin, once again rang out through the Hambleden Valley, as they have done over so many years, to herald the beginning of Advent. The words of the bidding prayer in the service, beautifully led by the Rev Andy Storch and the Rev Sue Morton before a congregation that filled the pews, said it all.

As we await the great festival of Christmas let us prepare ourselves so that we may be shown its true meaning. Let us hear, in lessons from Holy Scripture, how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem his waiting people. Let us rejoice, in our carols and hymns.

The service opened with the choir walking behind the Cross from the back of the Church to the altar in complete darkness. The only illumination was provided by scores of lighted candles, symbolising Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, carefully handed out to the congregation. Dexterity was needed to hold the candle, order of service and hymn book all at the same time. There was only one brief moment when a hint of singed hair was detected.

The six lessons were read by representatives from all the churches that make up the Hambleden Valley Group: Turville, Fingest, Medmenham, Hambleden, Frieth and Fawley. The reading of Prophet Isaiah provided the cue for the lights to be turned on again.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;
For a child has been born for us... and he is named
Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

We all blinked as the lights were switched on again and candles extinguished. The symbolism needed no words. The countdown to Christmas had begun.



## In praise of dog crates for feeding the birds



I love that old chestnut 'necessity is the mother of invention' although in my case, there is often a need for several attempts at the invention to resolve the necessity but the process is always a highly enjoyable one. Trying to solve some perceived problems can be fairly continuous and selective bird feeding is one of them. Recently, someone kindly offered me several bags of different bird food and a huge tub of fat balls (thankfully not individually encased in nylon netting in which birds' feet can get entangled) and I gratefully accepted on behalf of my garden's hungry avian visitors. As I dusted down well-cleaned feeders to fill with the bounty, I began to prepare myself for acceptance that a lot of it was going to end up feeding crows, jays, magpies and finally the pheasants and pigeons who sadly reach all the fallen seed on the ground before any blackbirds or thrushes.

#### WILDLIFE AND HAMBLEDEN

The aforementioned corvids have worked out if they make a feeder swing, a cascade of seeds ensues; I have never managed to curtail their success. A small dog cage on a shelf to my right caught my attention. It's the one I use occasionally to keep hedgehogs in overnight before a trip to Tiggywinkles but most of them are safely in hibernation now. Within minutes, fat ball holders were stuffed and hanging up inside the cage and the sunflower seed feeder was in the centre of the tray and the whole contraption was on the lawn but near cover offering protection. Before long tens of tits and a robin were feasting inside the cage, two pigeons and a jay were outside perplexed and I was punching the air in delight. Why had I not thought of this before?

Very easy to clean with a hose too.

will put the peanuts out for the woodpeckers: I have a superb hanging nut feeder which flummoxes all corvids (and sauirrels) because access to the nuts tantalisingly slides out of sight under their weight.



Mary the Virgin in Turville. Having been closed since May for restoration, its beauty masked by scaffolding and a portaloo, it was a joy to be reminded again of the building's majesty, and its integral position and role as our village's centre.

White wine (tactically chosen—I assume—to protect the freshly cleaned parquet flooring) and delightful finger sandwiches were consumed merrily by dozens of curious attendees, who were no doubt touched by the striking architecture of the building, perhaps encouraged for the first time to really soak in the vision and handiwork of the many who have designed, built and sustained the church for nearly a millennium.

The evening also marked the unveiling of the ostentatiously named (by me) "Turville Tapestry" (a future contender with the Bayeux, of course). While the building was closed, we brought the church outside to the churchyard, designing and sewing individual six-by-six-inch tapestry squares. sixty of which eventually came together to form a large patchworked wall-hanging. This is available to see temporarily propped up on a pew within the church until it settles in its final home somewhere on the wall. You can also find a print publication and greeting cards available for sale there; a way to both commemorate the project and raise funds for the church's ongoing upkeep and mission.

Community is a beautiful thing, and the

church is now an *especially* beautiful place to host it. Its little hiatus was a small sacrifice made by all of us in 2024 that points backward with gratitude to our forebears, and forward to our successors with provision and kindness. An acknowledgement that this sanctuary was, is, and will continue to be, life-giving. Our church's reopening is a moment to pause and give thanks; to the wardens, the builders, the architects, the donors, the villagers, the priests and—above all—to the Lord Jesus Christ, on whose love it is all built.
