



Community Matters August 2024



Children can search for Noah with the animals entering the ark, at least 2 dragons, a lion, and many other animals and birds.

Come and explore the windows, and we will take you on a tour from Adam and Eve to Mary, Queen of Heaven, and explain where you can find locally the start of a route to pick up the Camino de Santiago de Compostela in northern Spain.

The church will be open every day of the festival, but please be aware that this is place of prayer and worship, and be considerate of all users. 



Frieth Natural History Society

The Silver-Washed Fritillary butterfly and the Chalkhill Blue

Despite it apparently being a poor year for butterflies, in my work as a volunteer

for the Berks. Bucks and Oxon Wildlife Trust, I have been lucky enough to see several large, bright orange Silver-Washed Fritillary butterflies fluttering along the woodland rides at Warburg Nature Reserve near Henley, and they can also be seen in Homefield Wood. These magnificent butterflies are encouraged by the work carried out by volunteers to coppice hazel trees; this old woodland management practice lets sunshine into the woodland glades which allows clumps of dog violet to grow. The butterflies lay their eggs near the violets and when the caterpillars hatch, they feed on the plants. Adult butterflies swoop down to take nectar from bramble flowers.

The other really beautiful butterfly I saw for the first time this year was the Chalkhill Blue, again at Warburg Nature Reserve, but this time grassland. The male butterfly is blue with a black and white border to the wings, whereas the female is brown and less commonly seen. Caterpillars of this butterfly feed on horseshoe vetch. Suzanne and Leonard Phillips of Medmenham are great supporters of wildlife and have planted horseshoe vetch and created butterfly scrapes on their attract land to these increasingly rare butterflies. which only occur on southern chalk and limestone grasslands.



MEDMENHAM

A Life in Medmenham part 1

I was born in 1936 about half a mile on the Marlow side of the Medmenham parish boundary. But my grandmother, Mrs Sartin, had managed the village post office and shop at Gillman's Cottage since 1898 and my mother and I frequently visited her so I always felt at home there. I first sang in the church choir in 1943.

My father, whose family lived in nearby Frieth, returned to work as a gardener

at Medmenham Abbey in the autumn of 1946, where he had previously been employed in the 1920s, marrying my mother there in 1924. We lived at 3 Ferry Lane (now named Sharrow Cottage) and in 1947 suffered such severe flooding that I was rescued by punt and taken right up to the lower church gate. It was in those days a two up two down cottage with no indoor bath or toilet. Open fields faced us to the West. In eleven happy years there I attended primary and grammar schools in Marlow, did two years National Service (in the Royal Artillery), and completed my first year at Oxford 1956/7.

In the mid-1950's with the death of the last owner of the Abbey and its estates, Arthur Bendir, the village experienced a major social upheaval. There was no longer a significant employer in the village and a score of workers, including my father, lost their cottages. My mother managed to arrange a quarter mile move down the lane for us

to the Abbey's West Lodge, occupied before us by the dairymaid, and shortly to be renamed, rather selfishly by me, 'Olmeda' after a recent first visit to Spain. The cottage was indeed sheltered by elm trees but now they have all disappeared. We arrived here on the 17th of August 1957 and, with amazing good luck, it is still my home.

I completed my Oxford degree in 1959, followed by three chaotic years in which I did research and strove to obtain a university post in a new academic subject, War Studies, in which there was virtually nothing on offer. I took temporary teaching posts, including one at Reigate Grammar School, which transformed my life. I lodged with a Mrs Cromwell and met her niece, my future wife, Madeleine, who lived and worked at nearby Horley. Madeleine visited Olmeda a few times and was enchanted by the cottage and the village.
