I have a special mug with the following words printed on the side: *'Not all who wander are lost'*. It always makes me smile as I am not blessed with a good sense of direction and can find myself doing a lot of wandering - and a fair bit of wondering - as I try to get back on the right path.

But we can also learn a lot from our wanderings; our paths through life don't always tend to be straight, or necessarily go in the direction that we hope for. There is the story of a bus-full of wedding guests, invited to a marriage in Turville, finding that the driver had mistakenly taken them to a different Turville, 40 minutes'

drive in the wrong direction. It can be so easy to lose our way.

And Jesus knows this; in the Bible we read three consecutive passages about lost things - a coin, a sheep and a lost son - as Jesus encourages us to recognise the lostness in ourselves and others and to seek his love and grace.

Harvest is a time when we can support others whose path is not going the way they might choose; when giving food or donations to Community Matters, some have shared with me that they themselves have nearly been on the path that would have required support from Foodbanks. At the annual Animal Blessing (3pm, Saturday 5th October) a group of animals/insects/birds and other creatures faithfully bring their owners to the Village Green in Turville and there is some of God's glorious chaos as we give thanks to him for our companions. Andy's Induction and Installation

Luckily the long-term weather forecast got it wrong and we were blessed with sunshine on this very special morning, Sunday 1st September 2024. Around eighty people attended the service, including one very well-behaved baby.

The service was led by the Archdeacon of Buckinghamshire, the Ven. Guy Elsmore, who guided us with a great sense of humour through the service, making the whole thing easy to follow and enjoy. In his sermon he spoke about the first 25 years of his ministry being spent in urban Liverpool, when David Shepherd was still the Bishop of the area. He told us about a little church in Everton called the People's Church, which is a proudly non-denominational church and had been there for many years. This little church had its own carpark which began to suffer from unauthorised use. This resulted in a big wall being built around the carpark so that you could hardly see the church and a sign erected saying 'People's Church Private Car Park'. He then went on to speak about how this sign captures the tension between two very recognisable, and very human, religious tensions. He

referred us to the Gospel reading of the day which pointed out the two kinds of religion. There is the religion that brings walls down, promoting peace, transforming enemies into friends and creating love and harmony. Then the one which builds walls turning friends into enemies and sowing division, intolerance and hatred. Perhaps this can still be seen this day as either the 'walls down' churches where we are in it for others and the 'walls up' churches where we are in it for ourselves. Perhaps this is something we should all be aware of and make it something we need to work at.

A moving part of the service was when the Archdeacon led Andy by hand to the rear of the church by the main door where Andy laid his hand on the wall of the church and then was duly presented with the key to the church. (It is only those in the know that realise this was in actual fact the large key to the door in the Lady Chapel!). Andy then rang the church bell.

Lastly, the Archdeacon led Andy to his stall in the church, placing him in it saying "*Andrew Julian Storch, I install*

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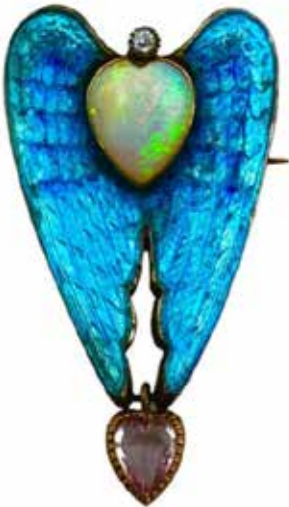
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you as Rector of this Benefice.” And to the congregation he said “People of this Benefice, I present to you your new Rector I commend him to your love and prayers.”

Jo grew up in a musical family, and spent her teenage years playing the piano, playing the flute in the Bromley Youth Orchestra, and singing in bands alongside her equally talented brother. By the time she was

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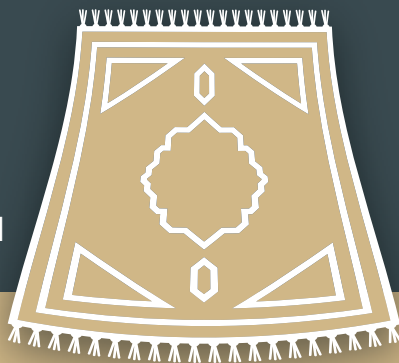
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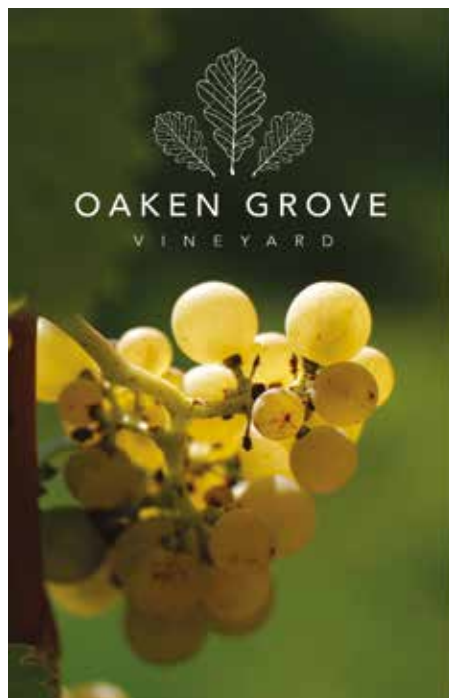

All welcome and refreshments are available, but for non-members we make a small charge.

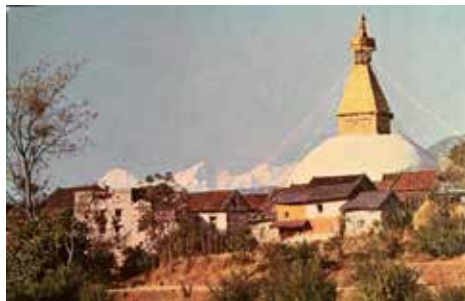

A Naturalist's Reminiscences No. 10

In my previous reminiscence I described how I nearly provided a lunch snack for a tiger. Once settled in yet another leaking tent high up in the Himalayas, I started my new attachment as a Recruiting Officer for the British Gurkhas in the Kathmandu Valley. You will appreciate that I was as far away from Eaton

Hall Officer Cadet School as possible because I was suspected of poaching the Duke of Westminster's pheasants and other crimes. Me? I was totally unqualified for this attachment as I could not speak Gurkhali but fortunately my Batman spoke good English and taught me the basics.



Kathmandu

I have to admit that I found my new job an 'absolute doddle'. I went on regular recruiting treks up and down the valley. When I arrived at each village, the village headman had already organised potential recruits in their hundreds, some of whom had spent weeks walking into that village. My role was to recruit solely for the British Gurkhas so I soon found the best solution was to ask for recruits who had already had a family connection with the British Gurkhas such as a father, grandfather etc. That was no real problem as once trained they were likely to be posted to Singapore or Hong Kong in those days. Nobody seemed anxious to join the Indian Army. So keen were those selected for the British Army that the moment they had completed their initial training they were all swinging their arms and marching everywhere in step.

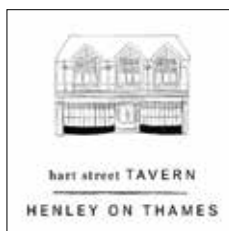
The history of Gurkhas serving in the British Army goes back to the Indian Mutiny in 1857 when the King of Nepal sent two battalions to support the British

MEDMENHAM

A Life in Medmenham part 2

After I left Reigate, I took a Tutorship at Exeter University (1961 - 62), but this was upset by the death of my mother in February 1962. At last, I gained a lectureship at Liverpool University to begin in September 1962. Madeleine and I married on Saturday 15th September and we moved to Liverpool (in the removal van to save money) on Wednesday the 19th. It was a scholarly history school; and the city was a cultural jewel even before the advent of the Beatles. However, we were not really happy; we were not keen on urban life and we both had lonely,

grieving relatives in the south.

I have only lately come to appreciate fully our amazing good fortune in the years 1962 - 66. My father could not bear to live at Olmeda alone so he found alternative lodgings in the village and let the cottage to an anarchist family who transformed the dwelling into a shambolic hovel! He sadly put Olmeda up for sale at a very modest price but no one wanted it so it stayed empty for about a year. Then, in early 1966, I was offered a lectureship in the newly-created Department of War Studies at King's College, London. My father most generously gave us Olmeda completely free, and we arrived 'home'. I had the career I coveted and Madeleine a home she would transform with remarkable skill and originality.

It might be enough to conclude here that 'we lived happily ever after', but I should like to cover the remaining decades briefly. In the 1960s, 70s and 80s we played a prominent part in village life. We ran a whist drive and a series of winter lectures given by local residents. We began the

'Meet and Greet' parties for newcomers; entered and won the Best Kept Village competition; and took part in the annual Village Fete. Madeleine devoted a huge amount of time to a church in Reading, where she was secretary for many years; and was very involved in my work, typing my books and articles, and accompanying me on overseas visits. The 'Jewels in the Crown', were five lecture tours which I gave in Japan. For Madeleine they fulfilled a lifelong ambition and she provided a combination of charm, elegance and tact which smoothed the path on a few tricky occasions.

It was only at the onset of Madeleine's cruel illness from about 2019 that the wonderful life at Olmeda lost some of its sparkle. Madeline died on 1st February 2023, one day short of her 89th birthday. She often referred to the village and countryside as 'Paradise'. She is buried in Medmenham Churchyard where I will eventually join her ending the remarkable saga of our earthly life in Medmenham.
