

In praise of bowls of water for hedgehogs

Please put out some shallow bowls with fresh water in your gardens for hedgehogs and keep replenishing them every day particularly during dry spells. Over a two-year period, I put wildlife cameras out to monitor hedgehogs here. Obviously, I was hoping to see footage of baby hoglets or courtship or even fighting when the less dominant creature curls into a ball and is pushed away by the aggressor rather like a croquet ball. I recorded none of the first two and only a few clips of the latter, night after night it was video after video of hedgehogs drinking fresh water. I am not a scientist but in time, along with lack of favoured

food such as beetles and caterpillars, their demise may well be proven to be linked to an increasingly drier climate. In my experience, hedgehogs clearly need a lot of fresh water and most particularly lactating females. Please keep these water bowls topped up all summer long.

A Naturalist's Reminiscence No. 15

In a previous Reminiscence, I had just returned to our camp after searching Kukko Monasteru. You will recall that the Chief Monk had assured me that my platoon had stolen nothing whereas the Adjutant had just told me that Archbishop Makarios' grandfather clock had gone missing and the police were about to search our camp. I immediately ran up to my platoon's lines where to my horror, the Dagenham boys were just assembling it. So, I had to instruct them to put the clock into the deep trench latrine (loo) at the bottom of their lines. The police arrived, searched the camp, found nothing and duly returned to the Central Police Station in Nicosia.

In 2013 I was back in Bury St Edmunds to celebrate a special reunion of all those who had served with the Suffolk Regiment in Cyprus. I was approached by somebody my age who asked whether I was 'Mr Waller'? It was one of the Dagenham lorry drivers who went to Kykko Monastery. Not only had he returned to Nicosia with another Dagenham driver a decade previously, found our camp then disused, hired a digger, recovered the clock which was still in a reasonable condition, and


