

She leaves, of course, an enormous gap for all of us here as she and Mark re-settle in Ewelme. We wish them every blessing - and some rest!

Having always had Sue at my side, I certainly feel a little bit at sea, and I would value your prayers as the process begins to find our next associate priest. There is a wonderful sample prayer within this issue. One aspect of Sue's ministry I knew I could not take on myself was Wild Church. This is such a shame, as it has been a marvellous ministry, attracting all sorts, from all over, and using so creatively each specific location it travelled to. However, a new thing will soon begin.

On Sunday 1st March at 3pm (with a following wind this magazine may arrive before that!), we are piloting a new family service at Turville. We think we may call it 'Church Sandwich' because it will involve food such as sandwiches, tea and coffee; and there will be age-appropriate activities in the 'meat' of the service. The 'slice of bread' each side will be an opening section, with a song and a reading, and a closing section, with some feedback on the theme and song and prayer. Do join us in our experiment, whatever age you are and whether you come alone or with others!




chalice reflection of Jesus for 'one of a certain height'. They all made their mark, and yes Mark and four daughters were and are very much part of our Essex girl's story.



Boxing Hares Herald the Turning of the Season



One recent winter evening, as I was driving down Ferry Lane, Medmenham, a large, lithe animal jinked out in front of the car, stared at my headlights and tore back over the ditch into Kim and Tim Jones' wood. It was unmistakably a beautiful brown hare! I felt a thrill, as always, when encountering this mystical animal, although in the past such meetings might have been more frightening. Hares were often thought to be witches in disguise, and, indeed, in one of Turner's pictures, on display in the Turner/Constable exhibition at Tate Britain until 12th April, a witch in the form of a hare can be seen running from right to left, pursued by three men and a dog (Colchester: Essex for Picturesque Views in England and Wales 1825-6). folklore it used to be thought to be bad luck to meet a hare if you were pregnant, in case your unborn child developed a hare lip.

Hares had arrived in Britain by the Ice Age and pushed back the indigenous mountain hares to places above 500 metres above sea level. They thrived in lowland areas in the nineteenth century because gamekeepers protected them for the purposes of hunting. They have made their home in the Hambleton Valley for many years and I used to see twelve grazing in one of the Mill End fields. I have also accidentally startled them from their forms (hollows in the grass where they hide during the day) in the rough grass under the ancient woodland trees at Warburg Nature Reserve where I work as a volunteer. Hares are interesting to watch at this time of year as the boxing often seen is the female testing the strength of one or more males. She picks the strongest and mates with him. Hares give birth in a form on the ground, so leverets are not as safe as rabbits in a burrow and can be predated by foxes and stoats. Leverets were raised outside the kitchen window of a friend from Mill End with the mother hare returning every night just after dusk to feed her young. If you want to know more about hares, Chloe Dalton's book, 'Raising Hare' is a delightful description of a wild hare who made her home in Dalton's house and garden during the Covid years. Unlike many wildlife books, it is a very uplifting story!

Hambleden Cinema

Join us on the 21st March to watch *Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid*, rated PG, a 1969 American Western buddy film. It is based loosely on fact, the film tells the story of Wild West outlaws Robert LeRoy Parker, known as Butch Cassidy (Paul Newman), and his partner Harry Longabaugh, the 'Sundance Kid' (Robert Redford), who are on the run from a crack US posse after a string of train robberies. Can My Rug's Fringe or Side Cords Be Repaired?

Good day-to-day care can significantly reduce wear to a rug's fringes & side cords, which are vital structural elements of Persian, Oriental & hand-knotted rugs. These areas naturally take the most strain, as they are exposed to foot traffic, vacuuming & regular handling.

Prevention starts with gentle maintenance. Avoid vacuuming directly over fringes, as this can pull & weaken the warp threads. Instead, clean fringes by hand or use low suction. Rotate rugs periodically so wear is spread

The whole project was considerably less stressful than you might expect thanks to the excellence of our architect, Libby Watts, Director of LibertyRose Architects, and our specialist contractor Ward and

Libby received the award from the Ecclesiastical Architects & Surveyors Association and the National Churches Trust as part of the Church Architecture Awards. The works included repairs to the tower roof, improvements to drainage and damp issues, new lighting and electrics, redecoration and plaster repairs, renovation of the WC, roof repairs, stonework and glazing, and much-needed improvements to heating throughout the church.

Some of the most revealing work took place in the south porch. When cracked cement render was removed, a historic timber frame with brick infill panels was uncovered. These were carefully repaired and conserved, not only improving the condition of the building but also deepening

understanding of its long history.

Commenting on the award, Libby said:

"I am delighted to have won the EASA and National Churches Trust Young Architect of the Year at the Church Architecture Awards. It is a privilege to work on such incredible buildings with such amazing craftspeople, and to have been recognised for my work is brilliant. I am thrilled, and very grateful to everyone who has supported me."

Emily Jackson, Church Buildings Officer at the Diocese of Oxford, praised the project for its close collaboration between architect, parish and diocesan teams, and for its consistent use of best conservation practice and traditional materials.

The PCC is delighted that this work has received national recognition. The project was only possible because of the commitment and generosity of parishioners and supporters of St Mary's, whose donations, encouragement and patience throughout the works made this transformation achievable. Thanks to them, the church is now in excellent condition and well equipped for worship and community use for many years to come.
