Group Letter

Dear friend,

Grass Snakes

A rustle in the dry leaves beside the footpath; a sinuous whip of a creature winding its way across the surface of a pond; an olive-green tail disappearing into long grass; leathery whitish eggs revealed when you turn your compost: all of these could alert you to the presence of the largest species of snake found in England (females grow up to over a metre long).

The recent heat waves have encouraged more grass snake activity than usual as snakes are more active in the heat. They need to bask to bring their body temperature up to about 30 degrees Celsius before they can do anything! You are therefore unlikely to see them in rainy or cloudy weather and they are diurnal animals, so you won't see them at night. You may have seen one swimming across your garden pond or in pools near the river. When swimming, grass snakes often keep their heads above the water like a small periscope and their bodies undulate laterally behind them.

They are very easy to recognise as they have a distinctive black and yellow collar and a round pupil to their black eye whereas adders have red eyes and their pupils are vertical

slits. Grass snakes are not venomous and mainly eat frogs, toads and newts.

Grass snakes spend the winter hibernating and come out in about March, when they are particularly slow-moving after the winter. If there are several males about, they form a mating ball around the female who gives out delicious pheromones. Eggs are laid in a warm place like on a compost heap or a pile of grass clippings and I have indeed seen juvenile grass snakes coiled together on a pile of grass clippings beside a ditch.

Grass snakes are tasty snacks for herons, crows, badgers and weasels. The most interesting trick grass snakes use to confuse their predators is thanatosis or playing dead. The snake can hold its mouth open and make its body go flaccid, even emitting blood by a process called auto haemorrhage. If

this doesn't work, the snake sprays out an evil-smelling liquid from its anal glands which usually results in it being dropped. It is therefore not a good idea to pick one up!

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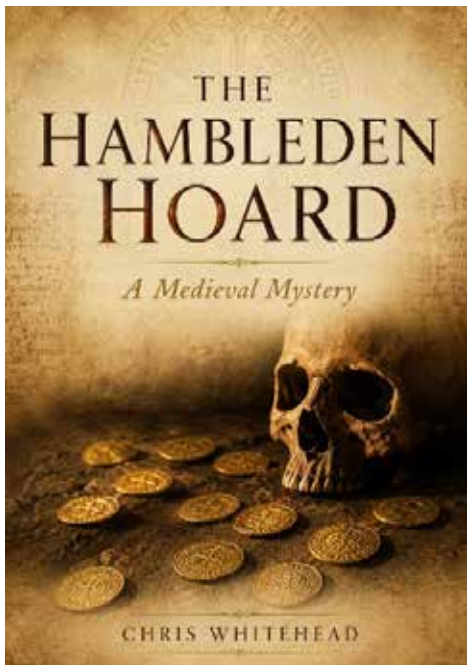

The Hamblemen Hoard



History often survives in the most unexpected places. Sometimes it lies buried beneath the floors of ruined abbeys or hidden within the archives of great cathedrals. Occasionally, however, it emerges from an ordinary ploughed field, where chance and persistence combine to reveal a story that has remained untold for centuries.

Such was the case on a spring afternoon in 2019, when four metal detectorists searching farmland in Dairy Lane uncovered one of the most remarkable medieval coin hoards discovered in Britain in recent decades. It has become known as the Hamblemen Hoard.

Every archaeological discovery raises questions. Why was the hoard buried? Who owned it? Why was it never recovered?

My recent booklet attempts to reconstruct the circumstances that may have led to the burial of the hoard. It combines archaeological evidence, documentary records, local history and medieval numismatics to explore a possible explanation.

Year 6 Residential



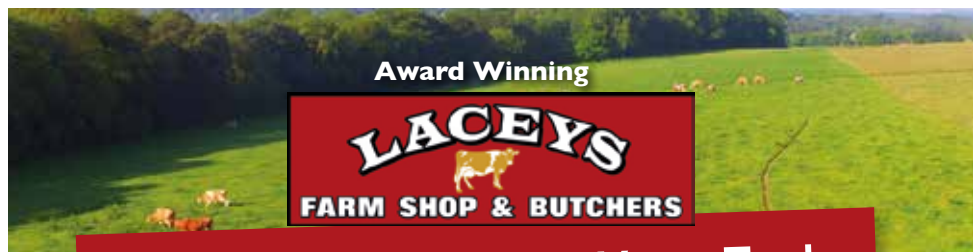

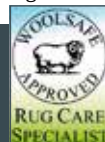

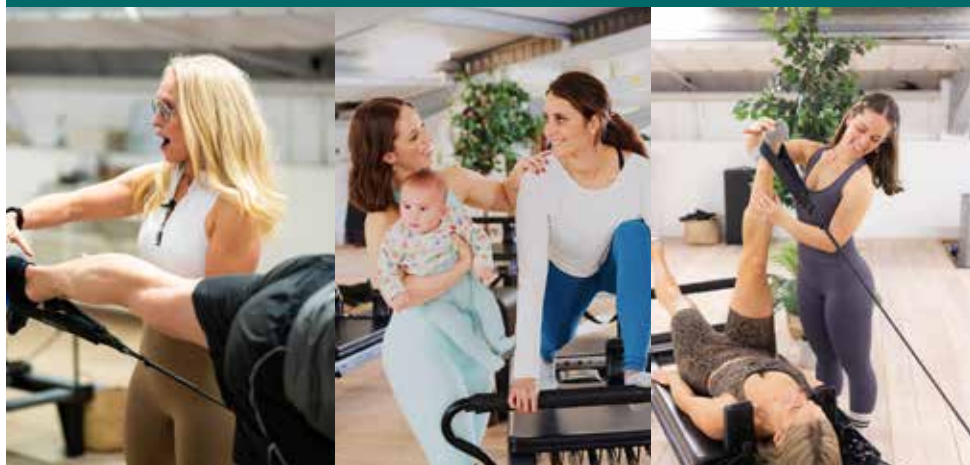
